Special thanks to our colleague Barb Astle for drawing our attention to this new publication produced by a task force of the Planetary Health Alliance (PHA). Initially convened in July 2019, and building upon an earlier Lancet publication of cross-cutting-principles for planetary health education, the task force embarked on a 16-month five-phase initiative that culminated last month in the release of a remarkable comprehensive report.

A special feature of this framework is the identification of five domains that are proposed as the essence of planetary health knowledge, values, and practice:

- interconnection within nature
- the Anthropocene and health
- systems thinking and complexity
- equity and justice
- movement building and system change

Of course, these domains resonate well with the CCGHR principles, and the coalition style that characterizes our work. In fact, I think we should consider this publication as required reading for our recently launched BCCI-3 adventure. I would strongly recommend both the Lancet comment and the framework document for homework.
